CREAMERY MEETING.

The Maple City Creamery patrons held a meeting last Saturday afternoon, which was only fairly well attended, owing to the heavy snow with farmers and the Spring Fair being held at the same time. However, the proprietor read a very complete and satisfactory report of the work done in December, January, and February, showing the business done, which amounted to \$2,250.87, and explained to the satisfaction of those present the way the business was carried on and the advantages of the proprietor having full control and being held responsible for all sales. By his close application to business as well as experience and ability as a salesman he had been able to pay to the patrons one cent a pound more for their butter than had been paid to the patrons of other creameries. As it is known that all the patrons as well as all those interested in creamery work, should hear the report and have any questions they wished to ask answered, and explained. Two more meetings will be held at the creamery on Saturday, May 6th, and Saturday, May 13th, at 1:30 p. m. The proprietor hopes they will be well attended by the farmers generally, and especially by the wives and daughters. Seats will be provided for their convenience and an individual print of Maple City Creamery butter presented to every body in attendance. The milk book on Monday showed eight new patrons and an increase of 1,161 pounds of milk over last Saturday.

In the list of cases Ald. McKeough had asked for in making his motion, he said.

Ald. Seane said that on the application of Mr. Douglas he had authorized the sending for ex-Ald. McPhee as a witness in the case. Mr. McPhee came, but was not used in the case. His expenses to the city were \$40.

BOARD OF WORKS MATTERS.

The matter of arranging a tariff of fees with the city solicitor for the revision of frontage by-laws was referred to the Board of Works with power.

The Board of Works were empowered to advertise for tenders for granolithic walks.

John Park, of Duluth street, asked permission to construct a walk at his own expense outside the trees.—Granted conditional on compliance with by-law.

The Board of Works were instructed to go on and complete the macadam road.

On motion of Ald. Martin the Clerk was instructed to notify Contractor Kime to go on and fulfil his contract on the walks.

Ald. Martin said that he had a full list of the walks condemned.—Referred to Board of Works.

A NEW ENGINEER.

Ald. Marshall and McKeough moved that J. W. Shackleton be appointed city engineer, to be employed by the month at \$70 per month.

Ald. Martin said it was the understanding between the parties that the position was taken on trial.

The motion carried.

Ald. Cowan asked that certain painting and whitewashing be done in the Fire Hall.—Referred to property committee.

Ald. Sulman moved, seconded by Ald. Liddy, that whereas it was impracticable to carry any by-law giving the cyclists the use of the sidewalks and protect the city and be in the general interests of the citizens, no such by-law be introduced.

Ald. Sulman said that the papers were coming this matter and he thought it had better be settled at once. The cyclists were only a small portion of the citizens and he did not believe in granting them any more privileges than they enjoyed at present.

Ald. Martin said that a draft by-law had been prepared and had been considered by the Board of Works. While personally he was willing and anxious to grant the cyclists every possible privilege, he felt the by-law was too complicated and he feared unworkable.

Ald. Sulman motion passed. Ald. Stephens and McKeough alone voting nay.

The property committee asked power to add to the list of tenders for uniforms for the fire department.—Granted.
