DOMESTIC RECIPES.
Canteloupe Sweet Pickle.—Take seven pounds of the melons, which must be not quite ripe, and be pared and seeded. Boil in weak alum water till transparent, then lift them out of the water, and put them into a jar. To a quart of cider vinegar add two ounces of stick cinnamon, one ounce of cloves, and three pounds of brown sugar. Cook the melon in this for 20 minutes, then return to the jar. Seal up for two successive mornings, then seal tight.

LAUNDRY HINT.

Don't dip collars and cuffs or shirt fronts in boiled starch. They will be ruined. Rub the starch on the articles on the wrong side with a sponge and cold water. Dry as much as possible with the sponge and finally rub with dry cloths. Rinse the starch with cold water. The carpet is clean. Then let it dry.

MOULD IN BUTTER.
