RELATES STORY OF HUDSON TRIP Professor Brock Gives Interesting Account of Earl Grey's Journeys in the Far North--One Accident.

Ottawa, Sept. 15.—The secretary of state has received from Prof. R. W. Brock, who was with Earl Grey's party to the far north, an official mailed report giving a further account of the trip. More attention is paid to that part of the trip from Winnipeg to Norway House. There is a description of the St. Andrew's locks and of Old Fort Garry, which his excellency suggests should be presented by the nation as an historical monument.

Wagon's Landing at the outlet of Lake Winnipeg was reached on August 6 and the run to Norway House began. The weather was rainy and the launch broke down and bobbed about helplessly for an hour in wind and rain. Norway House was reached at 3, and there an appropriate welcome was extended. On Monday after lunch Countess Grey and party left party embarked for the north.

There seems to be no inherent difficulties in the way of again utilizing if necessary the back door of Canada through which, until the advent of the railways, the trade of the west was conducted. It should be feasible to ship the cattle of the west in modern steamships over the route which in their sail boats of the 18th century the court ladies of Louis XIV. could travel on a pleasure excursion.

Planked Steak So far as anybody knows, planked steak sprang into popularity not more than four or five years ago. Planked steak is a young cousin of planked shad, and where that began nobody can tell but there are savory reminiscences of it from along the coast of old Virginia, where the darlings used to nail the fresh caught fish to a hard wooden plank and cook it before a fire on the shore. Such fish, those who ate it declared, there never had been, but it remained for a hotel man to develop the idea.

Now not only are many kinds of fish planked, but steaks as well. Planked steak is a delicacy that is superseding the finest broil. So popular is it that a plank for broiling has become a household necessity east and west.

The plank is a piece of hard wood an inch or an inch and a half thick, smoothly oiled to any size. The steak or fish is laid on this and placed in the oven to broil. It may be turned or not, as the cook pleases. When it is done mashed potato is built all around the edge and the whole is returned to the oven to brown. Then it is buttered if it is steak, or garnished with lemon and parsley if it is fish, the plank is placed on platter and the food is served. The more the plank is used the better the flavor. A steak plank should never be used for fish, nor a fish plank for steak.
