for amounts to have been withdrawn
from the bank for that purpose.

In like manner, on the 30th June, the
Superintendent may have funds in hand
which has been withdrawn from a
credit established for Contingent
Expenditures and such funds he will
also deposit on that day to the credit
of the Receiver General as a receipt
of Indian Expenditures sending the
certificate of deposit forward to
the Department with his Contingent
account and vouchers for the month
of June, ~~year~~ but it must be borne in
mind that in no case is the un-
used balance of a credit to be
withdrawn from the bank where
it must lie at the credit of the
Department until the end of the
year when it will expire.

It is possible that different
credits for various purposes may
be opened in favor of the Superint-
-ent, and in that case it will be
proper for him to open an account
with each credit in the office
Ledger, showing on the one side
the amount or amounts placed
at his disposal for each particular
purpose, and, on the other side
the date, number and amount
of the several cheques he may have
drawn thereagainst, with the names
of the persons in whose favor
they are drawn.
