Note. - All Candidates for Junior Matriculation must take the Pass Subjects of Latin, Mathematics, English, History and Geography, and one of the following groups: (a) Greek: (b) French and German; (c) French and either Physics or Chemistry; (d) German and either Physics or Chemistry.

N. B.—The Greek option is recommended to intending Theological Students. For the options in groups b, c, and d, see the Curriculum of the University of Toronto.

The standing of Candidates who have passed, or may hereafter pass, the Examinations of the department of Elucation for First or Second Class Teachers' Certificates is accepted pro tanto at any Junior Matriculation Examination, i.e., Candidates will not be re-examined in the subjects already taken in the Departmental examinations.
