Here and There

The popularity of the Nova Scotia apple is rapidly growing in Europe. 1,103,980 barrels and 8,693 boxes were shipped in 1924-25 to ports in England, Scotland and Germany. Shipment also went to Newfoundland, West Indies, Central Canada and the United States.

Production of sugar beets in Canada during 1923 amounted to 159,000 tons, valued at \$1,922,666, and grown on 17,941 acres, according to the Bureau of Statistics. 6,000 acres have been planted to beets this year in Southern Alberta, due to the establishment of a sugar beet factory.

Suits and Showers

It may be assumed that when you have paid a good price for a good suit you think it ought to wear well and look well.

Some suits, not necessarily the most expensive, conform to this twofold standard of perfection; others don't. They neither wear well nor look well, and so get your suit "pussy-footed" them! For two or three months they never had a "drink" and so got dry.

It may seem strange, but it is nevertheless true, that if you had gone out now and again when there was a light shower, and so got your suit damp, or had hung the suit near an open window where the vapour-charged moist air could have got to it, it would have looked better and lasted longer.

Each time it leaves the mill has a good deal of moisture in it. The air in mills always kept moist with steam, not only that the material as woven may be damp, but because the moist air, by increasing the strength of the fibres as it is being made up, prevents breakages during the weaving. A dry atmosphere would mean unmanageable "fades" in the material.

So, instead of being so very careful, now and again, to see that it gets damp! A tailor suggests ten minutes in a "wet mist" as being the ideal drink for a suit, and that all suits that have not had a "drink" for some weeks should be laid within damp towels for a few hours.
