

Some delegates found fault with the judges others said the Government grants were not large enough, while there was also some kicking regarding the selection of judges for the holding shows, etc. Mr. Wade asked that each association intending to hold a show during the next winter make its application for listed at once, and also name its first four choices for dates, so that proper arrangements could be completed and there would be no clashes.
