## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 16 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of agricultural land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land.

Washington, Jan. 13—Two heavy earthquakes were recorded early today on the seismographs of George Town University observatory.

They were very pronounced, and were centered approximately between 2600 and 2700 miles from Washington, according to a conservative estimate of Rev. Francis A. Tondorf, the seismographical director.

## OPPOSITION AGAINST COMPULSORY SERVICE ALMOST DISAPPEARS

### Second Reading of the Military Bill in British House Carried by a Large Majority.

London, Jan. 13—Amid scenes of uproarious enthusiasm the House of Commons at eleven o'clock last night defeated a motion to reject the Military Service Bill by a vote of 431 to 39. Immediately afterward the House acceded to the Premier's request by passing the second reading of the bill without division.

The vote was chiefly interesting on account of the changed attitude of many of the 105 members who opposed it on the first reading.

The Premier's conference was a measure in this attempt to allay the slight remaining opposition to the bill in the House and have it pass the second reading of the bill.

His plan was furthered still more by the announcement that John Dillon, John Redmond's opponent in the Irish Nationalist party, would accept Mr. Redmond's decision and withdraw his own opposition. He stated that if all the Irish party and the Liberals had remained with him he never would have yielded.

The Opposition in the House of Commons to the Conscription Bill crumbled last night to a few cautious objectors.

When it came to the second reading of the bill last night, the Irish Nationalists had withdrawn from the Opposition.

The Labour men asked for assurances that the bill should not be used as a step towards general conscription or industrial conscription.

The Nationalist members, after voting against the bill on the first reading, now take the attitude that it does not concern them, although they are opposed to conscription on principle.
