MOSELEY, Hon. E. TILTON. (*Cape Breton.*)

Grandfather a U.E. Loyalist, who left the United States at the time of the revolutionary war, and settled at Halifax. B. at Halifax, 2 June 1844. Ed. at St. John and Dalhousie Colleges, Halifax. Admitted a barrister and attorney at law, July 1868, since which time he has practised his profession at Sydney, being now senior member of the law firm of Moseley and Chisholm. M., at Sydney, Isabel, dau. of late Samuel Brookman, Esq. Is a Municipal Councillor; Presdt. Cape Breton Lib. Con. A.s. First returned to the Local Legislature, for the Co. of Cape Breton, at g.e. Dec. 1874, defeating Hon. John Ferguson (Liberal) by a majority of 457. Again returned for same seat at g.e. 17 Sept. 1878, defeating Attorney General White and Duncan McKenzie (Liberal) by majorities of 597 and 909 respectively. Is a Commr. of Schools for the Co. of Cape Breton. After the g.e. of 17 Sept. 1878, at the meeting of members elected for the Local Legislature on the Liberal Conservative ticket, received the unanimous nomination of the party for the Speakership of the new House of Assembly. A Liberal Conservative, and a firm supporter of the Sir John A. Macdonald party and Administration.—*Sydney Club; Wentworth Place, Sydney, N.S.*

PATTERSON, WILLIAM ALBERT. (*Co'chester.*)

S. of Abram Patterson, Esq., late of Pictou, N.S., by Christina, eld. dau. of Rev. James McGregor, D.D., first Presbyterian Minister at Pictou, and grand s. of John Patterson, who came to N.S. from Paisley, Scot. B. in Pictou, 10 July 1841. Ed. there.
