general issue and give this Act and the special Act and the special matter in evidence at any trial to be had thereupon, and may prove that the same was done in pursuance of and by authority of this Act and the special Act.

All persons by any means or in any manner or way Penalty on 5 whatsoever, obstructing or interrupting the free use of the obstructing Railway, or the carriages, vessels, engines or other works free use of Railway. incidental or relative thereto, or connected therewith, shall, for every such offence, be deemed guilty of a mis-
- 10 demeanor, and on conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the common Gaol, of the District or County where the conviction shall take place, or in the Provincial Penitentiary, for a term not to exceed five years.

All persons wilfully and maliciously, and to the Penalty on prejudice of the Railway, breaking, throwing down, da-maging Hail-15 maging or destroying the same, or any part thereof, or any way. of the buildings, stations, depots, wharves, vessels, fixtures, machinery or other works or devices incidental and rela-
- 20 tive thereto, or connected therewith, or doing any other willul hurt or mischief, or wilfully or maliciously obstructing or interrupting the free use of the Railway, vessels or works, or obstructing, hindering or preventing the carrying on, completing, supporting and maintaining the
- 25 Railway, vessels or works, shall be adjudged guilty of a misdemeanor, unless the offence committed shall, under some other Act or Law, amount to a felony, in which case such person shall be adjudged guilty of a felony, and the Court by and before whom the person shall be tried
- 20 and convicted, shall have power and authority to cause such person to be punished in like manner as persons guilty of misdemeanor, or felons (as the case may be) are directed to be punished by the laws in force in this Province.

All fines and forfeitures imposed by this Act, or the Vines how recovered. special Act, or which shall be lawfully imposed by any by-law, the levying and recovering of which are not particularly herein directed, shall, upon proof of the offence before any one or more Justice or Justices of the Peace
- 40 for the District, County or place where the act occurred, either by the confession of the parties, or by the oath or affirmation of any one credible witness, which oath or affirmation such Justice or Justices is or are hereby empowered and required to administer without
- 45 fee or reward, be levied by distress and sale of the offender's goods and chattels, by warrant under the hand and seal or hands and seals of such Justice or Justices; and all fines, forfeitures and penalties, the application whereof is not hereinbefore particularly directed, shall
