

## BILL.

An Act to establish a Survey in front of the ninth Concession of Cornwall, (from Lot No. 22, westerly, to the limit of the Township,) as the governing line of the said Concession of Cornwall.

**W**HEREAS no line has ever been run by the authority of the Government between the eighth and ninth Concessions of the Township of Cornwall, further west than the west side of Lot number twenty-two, in front of the ninth Concession of the said Township; And whereas disputes have arisen between the inhabitants of the said ninth Concession with regard to the boundaries in front of their respective lots; And whereas, with a view to the final settlement of all disputes, the inhabitants of the said Concessions, west of said Lot number twenty-two, employed one John S. Bruce, Esquire, a Deputy Provincial Surveyor, to run the said line, from the said west side of Lot number twenty-two to the western limit of the Township, and have petitioned that the said line as run by the said John S. Bruce may be established as the boundary line in front of the said ninth Concession from the said Lot number twenty-two, to the western boundary of the Township; And whereas, the said John S. Bruce has made a plan of said line, and a copy of all his field notes relative to the said survey, and it is necessary and desirable that the said line should be established and all disputes on the subject of the said boundary line for ever settled:—Be it therefore enacted, &c.

That the line in front of the said ninth Concession as run by the said John S. Bruce, shall be to all intents and purposes, established as the boundary line of the said ninth Concession of the said Township, as fully as if the same had been originally run by the authority of the Government, and all parties interested shall be governed by the said line accordingly.
