Dear Mr. Meighen:

I have your letter dated July the 27th and note your remarks.

I have absolutely nothing against you, but I personally think that under present conditions it would be unwise to send anyone from Ontario into any of the Maritimes, as there is no doubt in my mind, that the next Federal will be run largely on Maritime Rights.

Frankly, I am very much disappointed in Mr. Rhodes. He has had no Executive training, and it is just possible that you are fortunate in being rid of him.

My present plans are to be in Toronto the last of August or the first three days of September.

There is nothing that I want except to be left alone. For twenty-five years I have been more or less in Politics and I am tired of the game, for there is absolutely nothing in it for me, either directly or indirectly, except abuse. Now that the Province has been won it should be an easy matter for others to carry on.
