One of these people wanted a recent photograph of myself but I said No. I have nearly two years on you and am beginning to feel the weight of such an age an age that amazes me more than it could anybody else. However, I keep in pretty good health after a couple of major operations two years ago, following up with a broken back eighteen months ago in a motor accident. I think I feel the effects of this yet and probably always will but I don't let it bother me.

Weather to do a little cruising up the St. Lawrence and Lake Ontario. Our thermometer here goes down to the 40's nearly every night. I haven't been attending the Senate at all this Session as aside from the money Bills over which I consider we have no control whatever there seems to be little but endless speeches on the Speech from the Throne, another matter that merely is directed to the House of Commons and when you and Dandurand were there could be finished up in a week. Now they run it for months and delude themselves into thinking they are actually doing some work. All the same, one must admit that we have some pretty good speeches on the matter but I don't think it is any of our concern.
