Sir.-

in reply to your telegram, the following was

"Build fence on West boundary Peigen Re-"corve on feet Amer of Melecute nounds except at the jog at "Old Men's River. By doing this no part of road allowance "will be on recerve. Diagram sent you by mail".

The diagram referred to in the above telegran is employed herewith. The read ellowance and lines
run by Mr. Releas shown thereon are taken from his field
notes. You will note that on the lines running North he
ran on the Yout side of the read ellowance, that is do feel
west of the Indian recorve boundary. On the Mast and West
lines, however, of the jog at Old Han's River, the field
notes show that he ran on the boundary itself of the recorve.

It is to be noted in the description of the reserve which accompanies the diagram or plan that he, Notes on states that each angle or corner of the reserve is marked by a post or nound. There should, therefore, be two posts and two nounds 66 feet apart at every corner and
