SIR,-

In reply to your telegram, the following was sent to you yesterday:-

* Build fence on West boundary Peigan Reserve 66 feet East of Nelson's mounds except at the jog at Old Man's River. By doing this no part of road allowance will be on reserve. Diagram sent you by mail*.

The diagram referred to in the above telegram is enclosed herewith. The road allowance and lines run by Mr. Nelson shown thereon are taken from his field notes. You will note that on the lines running North he ran on the West side of the road allowance, that is 66 feet west of the Indian reserve boundary. On the East and West lines, however, of the jog at Old Man's River, the field notes show that he ran on the boundary itself of the reserve.

It is to be noted in the description of the reserve which accompanies the diagram or plan that Mr. Nelson states that each angle or corner of the reserve is marked by a post or mound. There should, therefore, be two posts and two mounds 66 feet apart at every corner and
