

Ottawa 11th May, 1906.

Sir,

I beg to inform you that Mr A. Blue , Chief Officer of
the Census and Statistics Office, has asked this Department for
certain information regarding Indians for use in connection
with the prepartion of the Dominion Census Returns. Among
other things he he asks to be informed of the dates upon which
the several Indian Agents leave their homes to pay Treaty money,
in order that arrangements may , if possible, be made brore
hand to have them meet the Census Communications and received
instructions. The census, Mr Blue states, is to be taken as
for the date of June, 24th next. He is being informed that the
payments of annuity will not take place until July, and later in

I shall be glad if you can furnish, an early date, any information which may be of use to the Census Office.

I may add that Mr Blue states that the rate of allowance to Indian Agents who act as Census Enumerators will be the same as is provided for all other enumerators. He states further that where the Agencies are small it is found advisable to have the work done by local enumerators.
