Gentlemen:-

with reference to your letter of 15th instant, I have to draw your attention to the fact that the Canadian Pacific Railway Company has been in possession of the Right of Way through the Naiscoutaing, Maganettawan and Shawanaga Indian Reserves and of the borrow pit in the latter reserve since July 1905, and apparently it will be some time before the final amount to be paid by the company is determined. A small deposit on account of the Right of Way was made in 1905, of \$106.56. I have to request that a deposit on account of the said Right of Way be made with this Department of \$3,000. to be held until if the matter is decided; the sum decided upon is less than the deposits made, the company will make the necessary payment and the Department will make a refund if the said sum is less than the deposits.

I shall be obliged if you will have this deposit made with as little delay as possible.
