In view of this fact the Department desires to be informed why you stated in official letter of the 18th February (file No. 410,911) that Seton Lake, and Anderson Lake Reserves belong to the Lytton Agency. If at any time you were informed that these two last mentioned reserves were not within your jurisdiction, you should quote the official letter and file number.
