January.—Cattle will eat all that nature requires in a good warm barn, if it is judiciously fed to them, and they can have seasonable supplies of water. But nature will require more in an open barn, and still more in a cold yard. The fuel to feed the fires within will always bear a proportion to the cold atmosphere surrounding the surface of the body without, which is to be warmed in order to keep the creature comfortable. It is like placing a stove outside of the bouse to warm the circumambient air instead of placing it in your snug parlour. The extra out-door appetite is caused mainly by the extra exposure demanding extra. Hence, it is not difficult to find a reason for so many cattle looking lean and miserable in the spring.
