Due application of all such monies to be accounted for to Her Majesty.

XXXIII. And be it enacted, that the due application of all monies expended by, for, or under the superintendence of the said Board, shall be accounted for to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, in such manner and form as Her Majesty, Her Heirs, and Successors shall direct.

This Act to be deemed a public act.

XXXIV. And be it enacted, that this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a public Act, and as such shall be judicially taken notice of by all Judges and other persons and in all Courts without being specially pleaded.

C A P. XXXIX.

An Act to amend and enlarge an Act of the Legislature of the late Province of Upper Canada, intituled "An Act to ascertain and provide
" for the payment of all just claims arising from the late Rebellion
" and Invasions of this Province."

[17th August, 1841.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS by the fifth Section of an Act passed in the last Session of the Legislature of the Province of Upper Canada, intituled *An Act to ascertain and provide for the payment of all just claims arising from the late Rebellion and Invasions of this Province*, it is enacted, (among other things) that the Commissioners to be appointed by that Act should sit, from time to time, at two places only, and for a period not exceeding six days at each sitting, in each District; and it is by the tenth Section of the said Act provided that in no case, shall any Commissioner be allowed for more than fourteen days occupation in any one District; And whereas it is expedient to extend the Provisions of the said Act, so far as to enlarge the period for the said Commissioners holding their sittings; Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, intituled *An Act to Re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada and for the Government of Canada*, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners to sit twenty-eight days in each District, but at two places only in each District; and that neither
