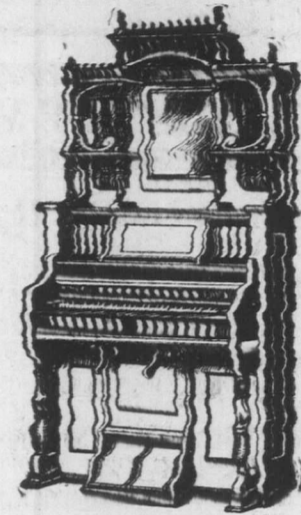

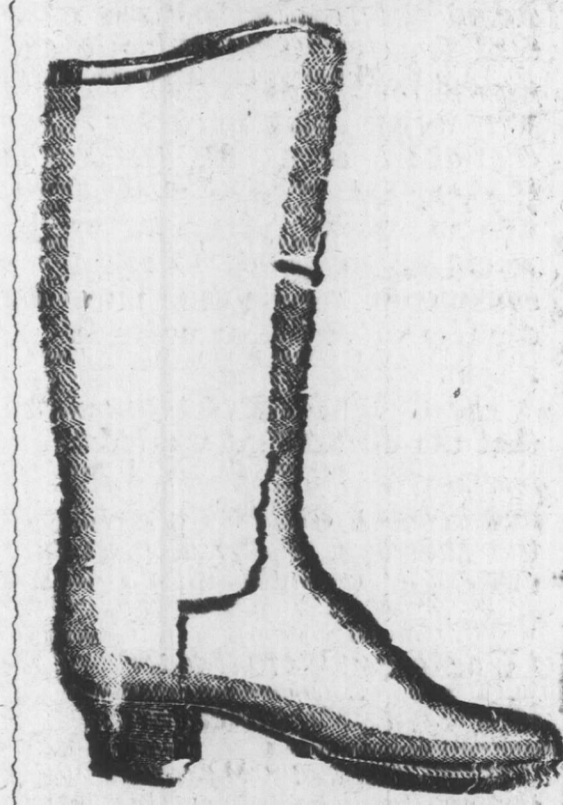

**Death of Mr. Burke at the Age of 77 Years**
