Quebec, Nov. 15 .-- With the advance estimates of the 1925-26 cut of timber placed at the record figure of fifteen hundred million feet by officials of the Department of Lands and Forests here, ndications are that the season will be one of the most active, at last so far as pulpwood is concerned, for many years past.

Reports received here show that already there are three thousand five hundred lumber camps operated throughout the province with the Lake St. John and Chicoutimi districts the centre of greatest activity.
