PETITIONS.

Mr Penny presented the following petitions: From James Eavens, mail carrier on the North Shore of Conception Bay, praying that his salary might be increased.

Mr Penny, in presenting the petition from the inhabitants of Western Bay, praying that a magistrate might be appointed to occasionally visit that place, observed that the petition is a very important one.

Mr McKay presented a petition from the inhabitants of Channel on behalf of Ann Cox, widow of the late Captain F Cox, Stipendiary Magistrate of Channel, praying that some consideration may be accorded her on account of her late husband's services.

Mr Mackay also presented a petition from Rev W A Haynes and others, of Upper Burgeo, which was received and read, praying for a grant of money to erect a bridge to connect the Island with the mainland.

Dr Skelton presented the following petitions: From John Moxbridge and others of Tickle Cove; from James Templeman and others of Fox Cove; from John Cheevers and others of Blate Cove; and from R Braumit and others of Portland, White Rock and James' Cove on the subject of roads and bridges.

Mr Goodridge presented the following petitions from Wm Kieley and others of Vitless Bay; and Michael Meivine and others of La Manche.

Financial Secretary presented the following petitions: From John Kirby and others of King's Cove; from A E Bayley and others of Upper Amherst Cove; and from Daniel E Ryan and others of King's Cove and vicinity; and from R Braumit and others of Portland, White Rock and James' Cove on the subject of roads and bridges.

Mr Rice presented a petition from the inhabitants of Twillingate proper, for a sum of money to complete the public wharf there.

Mr Carter supported the prayer of the petition.

Mr Winter presented a petition from the inhabitants of Burin, praying for a vote for the establishment of a ferry to connect Great Burin with the main land.

DOCUMENTS LAID UPON THE TABLE.

The Attorney General by command of his Excellency the Governor, begged to lay on the Table of the house the following documents:—

Report of General Water Company for year 1880.

Expenditure for Volunteer Fire Brigade for year 1880.

Report of Postmaster General for year 1880.

The Attorney General would call the attention of the house to the increase of business in this department. The number of letters received and sent last year exceeded the year previous by 4900.

The transactions in the money order department amounted to \$41,000. The letters to and from Labrador amounted to 14,000 one way and 17,000 the other.

This is a unanimous conviction that education has been of recent year doing its work most effectually.

Mr Winter gave notice to ask leave to introduce a Bill to provide for Appointment and Assessment of certain property in St. John's under provisions of Water Company Acts.

ORDER OF THE DAY.

Third Reading of the Revenue Bill. Upon motion of hon Receiver General, Bill was read a third time and passed, and ordered to be engrossed and taken to Legislative Council for concurrence.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE ON SUPPLY.

Upon motion of hon Receiver General the house went into Committee of the Whole on Supply.

Mr Watson in the chair. Upon the vote of \$1,000 for the Auditor General being proposed for adoption Mr Parsons said that he protested against this vote. There was no necessity for an Auditor General at all when there are so many other Generals with large salaries too who should do the work.
