Fish and Cull.

ong the water front is becoming more serious as the days of October pass. Very little fish is coming in and the opinion is expressed that the greater part of this seasons catch will be sold and shipped from the Outports, that is if the truck system operating in the cull is easier than at St. John's but this is offset by withholding cash payments for 3 months. From the master of a schooner now taking supplies, in port, we learn that most of the schooners to the northward are loaded with fish and ready to sail at the next favorable wind when we may expect a fleet of some 300 schooners along. The fishermen are not satisfied with the present prices and when they arrive they will demand \$10 per qtl. for average fish. Regarding the cull we were informed by a schooner master that on visiting a fish buying premises North, on the way here, a schooner was discharging Labrador Shore fish and, as it was coming out of the hold it was being packed in casks ready for shipment to market, very little being thrown out, though it appeared to be of poor quality. Whether the fish was culled before going aboard the schooner or not our informant did not know.


