Cinema Panic Horrors.

Twenty persons were burned to death and nearly 100 injured, many of them seriously, in a fire which has destroyed the Rialto Picture Theatre at Newhaven, Connecticut. There was a frightful panic, and many people were trampled down and overcome. The theatre is within a hundred yards of Yale University. The building, which was about a hundred years old, was formerly a church, and was later used as university classrooms. The audience where the fire occurred was composed largely of students who were escorting women. The fire started to ignite the stage draperies.

NO SYMPATHY WITH EXTREMISTS.

DUBLIN, Dec. 21. Warmly supporting advocates of the ratification of the Irish Peace Treaty, the Irish Independent says, "In heaven's name let Ireland take the substance and not dissipate her energies in discussing shadows." The Independent and Freeman's Journal refer to the onths of the Treaty and that of De Valera as "Tweedledum and Tweedledee." The Freeman's Journal asserts, "The Government with the consent of the governed and self-determination of the people, have vanquished with the Republican creed. That Ireland should be flung into a war with such gossamer issues and differences is a criminal proposition. Sanity must prevail."

HE IS QUITE RIGHT.

CHARLOTTE, NC., Dec. 21. Unless the submarine is destroyed, "root and branch" and an agreement reached for the reduction of land armaments, and the aircraft problem solved, the Washington Conference will have failed to "live up to its full duty and privilege," Josephus Daniels, former Secretary of the Navy declared in an address here last night.

DUFFY'S SPEECH.

DUBLIN, Dec. 21. Duffy's speech indicated that he assumed the Treaty would be ratified. He said it would be the duty of the Irish constitution to "place a foreign King at a considerable distance from the Irish people," adding, "The King symbolises in himself the just anger of the Irish people for 750 years."

SOLD OFFICERS OF STATE.

PEKING, Dec. 21. Liang Ship Yi has been named Premier of the Chinese cabinet, to succeed Chin Yun Peng, who with all his ministers resigned Sunday. It is charged that Chin Yun Peng was guilty of speculation and the sale of offices. The fall of the cabinet followed the arrival here of General Chang Tsao Lin, Governor of Manchuria, who is now engaged in forming a coalition government, in which all reactionary parties are participating.
