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CONS. COMING AROUND TO LAURIER'S NAVAL PLAN

H. B. Ames Does Not Agree Entirely With the Borden Idea.

Ottawa, Dec. 17.—The naval debate continues in a somewhat perfunctory way. Government supporters believe that the Government, while adhering to its policy of immediate contribution to the navy of the Empire, may yet find a way to adopt some of the best features of the policy outlined by the Laurier amendment.

The naval debate today was opened by H. B. Ames, of Montreal, who made a brief argument in behalf of the Government. W. M. German, of Welland, vigorously supported the Laurier amendment. Mr. Wilcox, the Conservative member for North Essex, declared himself strongly in favor of the proposed contribution to the Imperial navy. He was followed by Hon. Frank Oliver.

A Vigorous Speech.

Mr. German spoke with unusual vigor. Canada's dignity and Canada's self-respect were at stake, said he, and Canada was looking on. It was a remarkable exhibition to which the country had been treated. Not one Ministerial speaker who had yet addressed the House had attempted to submit anything which could be dignified by the name of argument in support of the Premier's proposals as against the sturdy, self-respecting and patriotic policy of Sir Wilfrid Laurier. The Conservatives had fallen back on the time-honored "Forry slogan." The old flag and an appropriation. With shameful lack of truth and patriotism they had described the old motherland as on her knees in beggary, dropping to decay, in deplorable financial condition, and in pitiable straits. They had shouted, "The Germans! get you if you don't watch out!" "They would," said Mr. German, "make Christianity a farce and civilization a mockery by helping a war between two of the great civilized Christian nations of the earth."

Mr. German followed Mr. H. B. Ames, who, following the Ministerial custom, talked out nearly all the afternoon. The member for St. Antoine declared that the Borden policy was a step forward to the day which was coming "when our Dominion will occupy in the empire the same place as the provinces now occupy in the Dominion."

He cut effectually adrift from the declaration of Premier Borden deprecating the creation of any Canadian navy, and emphasized the declaration that the present gift was only in the nature of an emergent offering, to be succeeded by the evolution of a permanent Canadian policy along some such lines as those advocated by Sir Wilfrid Laurier. "This spirit is becoming more manifest daily among the shrewd of Conservatives."

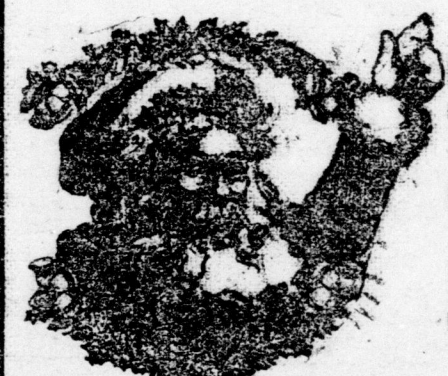

DYNAMITE TRIAL BROUGHT TO END

Vice-President of Ironworkers Locked Up For Malicious Perjury.

NOT AT LABOR'S DOOR

Presiding Judge Says That Conspiracy Was Not Work of Organized Labor.

Indianapolis, Dec. 17.—There was genuine surprise this afternoon when the defense in the dynamiting trial suddenly closed its evidence without calling nine of the principal defendants to the stand. These men are among those who had the most significant correspondence with Ryan and McNamara or were most active in the different steps of the conspiracies. The complete list of the defendants not testifying is: H. S. Hookin, Frank C. Webb, of New York; Edward Smythe, Peoria, Ill.; Eugene Clancy, San Francisco; J. F. Munsey, Salt Lake; O. A. Tveitmo, James E. Rae, Peoria, Ill.; Wm. McCain, Kansas City; P. J. Cooley, New Orleans.

Just before the court adjourned the district attorney moved that the bond be increased of John T. Butler, of Buffalo, first vice-president of the International Association of Bridge and

Structural Ironworkers, who is next highest in office to President Frank M. Ryan. District Attorney Miller said that Butler had stated in the courtroom that he "wished to God he had stayed in Quebec," as he knew the crime was not extraditable, and for the court's protection the bond ought to be increased. Butler committed wilful, malicious perjury and that was another reason why his bond should be increased, said the district attorney.

Judge Anderson increased Butler's bond to \$15,000 and said: "This man swore to what he knew was untrue. He made many conflicting statements, and I believe he committed wilful perjury. I have been on the bench and about courtrooms for 34 years, and I never heard such malicious perjury as has been committed in this case." Butler was locked in jail tonight.

Not at Labor's Door.

"I don't believe," said Judge Anderson, referring to the stories of violence, riots, assaults and dynamitings related on the witness stand, "I don't believe—and if I did I would not have any hope for this country—that organized labor stands for the things that have been shown here. There are a few people in this country who must be told that the law is the law, and if they are not, they will be retired for the day, and after Clarence E. Dowd, of Rochester, N. Y., formerly organizer of the International Association of Machinists in Detroit, had been discharged on the ground that
