given another hoist to a later date.

This was also the fate of the majority of the recommendations made to the committee by the mayor in his inaugural address. The committee found that the pressing items of the budget would make one good day's work and shelved what could be laid over for the next meeting.

Some of these may be taken up at a special meeting which it has been decided to hold to deal with the gas situation and the application of the City Gas Co. for an increase in rates.

As it will be necessary to secure the approval of the legislature, and as for the time to prepare for this is limited, the committee passed upon the proposed changes in the election set which the clerk made to the mayor and which the latter outlined in his inaugural address.

Clerks' Suggestions

The majority of the suggestions of Mr. Baker found favor with the committee. They differed with him on but one point. Instead of delaying the opening of the polls until 11 o'clock, the committee decided to keep them open to 8 o'clock, the committee set the hours of 10 to 7 p.m. In regard to the railwaymen's polling hours, courts of revision for the voters list, husband and wife voting as joint owners or tenants, and the paying of the city for the preparation of part three of the voters list, the committee immediately fell in with and approved.

With the approval of the committee, Mayor Wilson said he would ask the clerk to call a meeting of the heads of departments to see if it were not possible to bring all into closer co-operation.

Hamilton thinks it has a solution of the police court fines problem. The province contends that as the criminal code provides that fines levied under the code shall go to the province, it cannot remit them to the municipalities. In this way the province has successfully battled against the efforts of the city to share these fines.

Mr. Wilson now proposes to go to the Dominion government and have the criminal code changed so that the province can remit the fines to the municipalities. The committee will report on this.

Woodstock has another important legislative amendment, this time to the municipal act. At present if owners of property cannot pay taxes, tax collectors have no option but to call in the sheriff. Woodstock proposes a change.

of the institution in question should go out and collect funds, or did he think that the people who were not paid for should be pushed out on the street.

She said that there were many patients placed in the homes by their children. The latter later moved away and were lost track of. Many of them died. Their parents still lived and had to be cared for and thought they were not being paid for the home continued to care for them.

Mayor Wilson said that sentiment must not be allowed to interfere with the proper conduct of the city's affairs. He was not opposing the grant. Instead he wanted to aid in every way. However, the council was facing a large number of requests for aid and if there was any other way of securing the money he wanted them to do it. The mayor pointed out that the \$50,000 grant made last year was costing the city about \$3,000 yearly in interest.

Mrs. Hunt declared that it was the city people who had put the home in its present fix. It was up to the city to care for its own. Surely it had a right to care for them. It sent them there. Boarders paid \$10 a week, but the miserable pittance of sixty cents a day did not pay for the city patients. And surely they would not want them to go into debt for the city, she concluded.

The final conclusion of the committee was that it would do its best and will consider the matter with the estimates.
