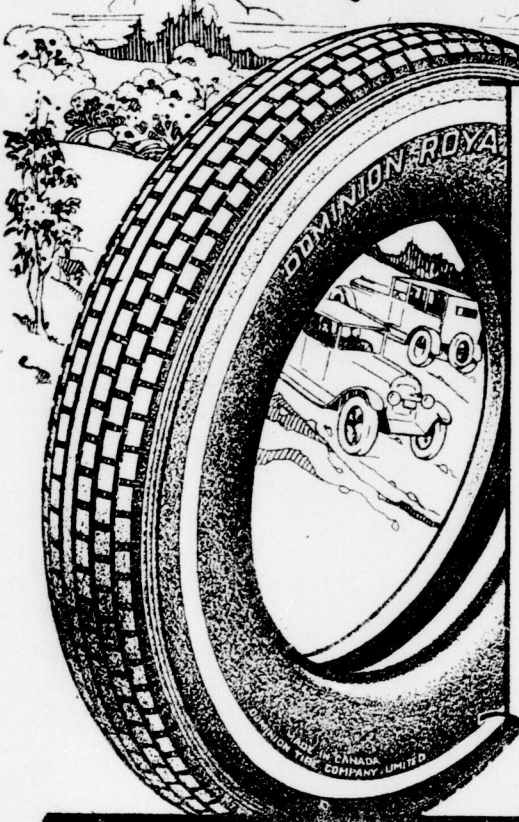

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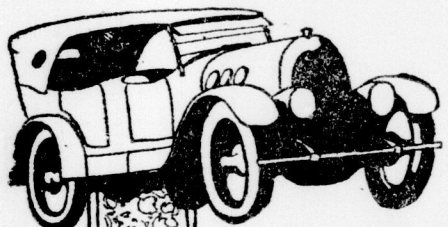

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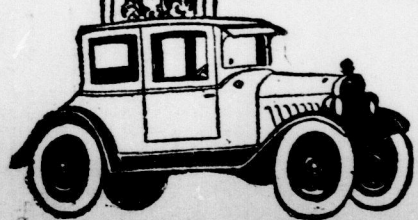
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BOARD THREATENS MILK PRODUCERS

Will Suspend Licenses If Law
Is Not Observed in
Future.

Action will be taken by the city board of health to cut off the licenses of three milk producers, should milk offered for sale by them be found below standard. At a minority meeting of the board yesterday warnings made by Dr. C. S. Tamlin, city dairy inspector, were ratified.

Dr. Tamlin reported visiting 65 dairy farms, taking 75 samples of milk and out of a day's supply of the product finding only one sample unfit on general score. However, he had reports of analysis by Dr. Slack of the Institute of Public Health. These showed three herds giving milk of low butterfat content.

These producers were warned of the condition of the milk they offered for sale and promised to improve their herds. One man was so anxious to avoid publicity that he went directly to a sale of pure-bred Jersey cattle and made several purchases of high-grade cows.

Is of Good Grade.
Generally, however, the milk supply is of good grade, Dr. Tamlin reported, and there are fewer faulty samples than in other years. During March he examined samples from 7,100 quarts of milk, supplied by 820 cows.

London's various epidemics of contagious diseases came in for some comment from Dr. W. S. Downham, medical officer of health, and Chairman Charles Mitchell.

Mumps and Measles are synonymous. This savage opponent of pickled eaters will romp home an easy winner in the 1925 sweepstakes for communicable diseases in London. There were 417 cases of this disease during the month, and the total for 1925 had reached 1,135 on April 1, more than half the total for all communicable diseases reported during the first three months of the year.

Hopes For Relief.
However, with the coming of Easter holidays for school children, and fine weather, Dr. Downham is confident a sharp falling-off in all forms of contagion. Mumps is more persistent than in years.

Other communicable diseases found the following numbers of victims: Diphtheria 7, scarlet fever 67, chickenpox 77, whooping-cough 65, measles 5, venereal diseases 4. Public health nurses made 412 visits during the month, most of this work being caused by mumps and skin diseases amongst poor families. Some 19 new cases were treated at the tuberculosis clinic and 130 old cases were treated. At the venereal disease clinic, 13 new patients were admitted for treatment.

Conditions Improved.
Many improvements in sanitary conditions in poolrooms, laundries, cafes, barber shops and other places of business were reported by Sanitary Inspector Richard Saunders, who is keeping persistent watch upon these places.

Sanitary sewers were recommended for Tennyson avenue and Brisbane street.

Chairman Mitchell and Dr. Downham were given authority to attend the annual convention of the Ontario Health Officers' association at Toronto during the first week in May.

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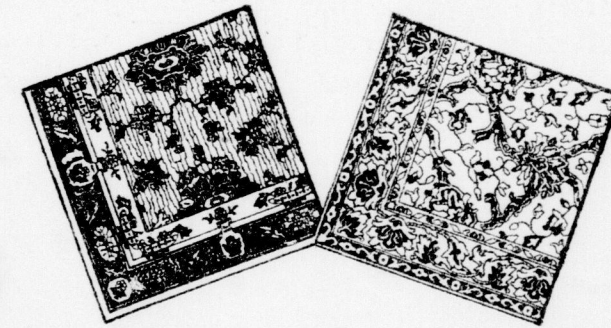
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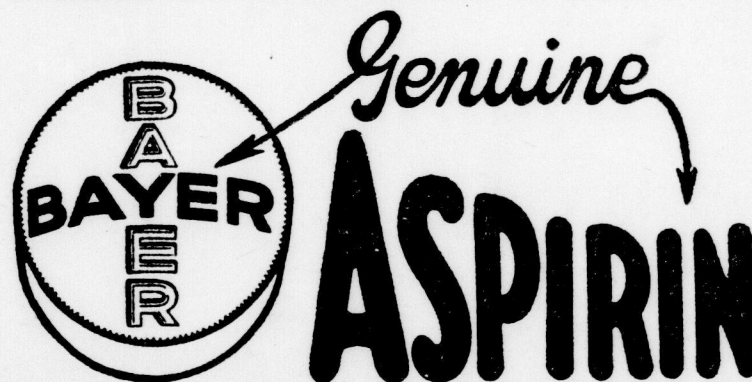
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
