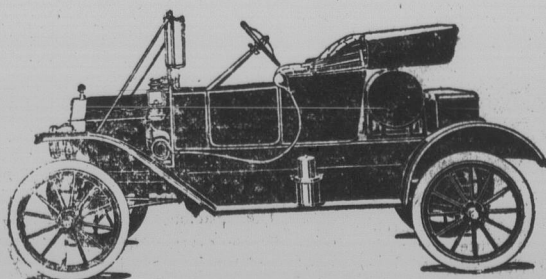

GENERAL MEETING OF COUNTY COUNCIL

Report of the Proceedings of
the Bonaventure County
Council at last Session

NEW BY-LAW

A general meeting of the County Council of the County of Bonaventure was held at the Town Hall, at New Carlisle, on Wednesday, the 17th of September, at 10 a. m., present: Dr. H. J. Martin, Mayor of Carleton Place; T. R. Buteed, "Mann"; Pierre Darche, "Port Daniel East"; F. X. Chapados, "Gascons"; J. A. Cyr, "Maria"; Jos. Doherty, "Escuminac"; Geo. Frenette, "St. Jean Evangeliste"; F. Blois, "New Carlisle"; Peter Dourlages, "Musseyville"; Thos. Levesque, "St. Alexis"; E. W. LeGallais, "Hope"; John Clement, "Paspheiac"; Peter Perlette, "Caplin"; John Oatman, "Restigouche East"; W. A. McPherson, "Port Daniel West". At the opening of the meeting the Warden and Pro-warden being absent, upon the motion of Mayor Buteed, seconded by Mayor Doherty, Mayor Martin took the chair. Moved by Mayor Blois, seconded by Mayor Buteed, that the minutes of the last meeting as read by the Secretary-Treasurer be approved, with the exception of the word jointly in the resolution relating to the maintenance of the Town Hall, said word to be struck out and replaced by the following words: "each to receive one half the insurance. Passed."

The question of the Green Point and Campbellton bridge for vehicles and pedestrians over the Restigouche River, and the petitions relating thereto coming from the different local Municipalities, being duly discussed and deliberated upon by the Council, it was moved by Mayor Buteed seconded by Mayor Oatman, that this Council do appoint three delegates to proceed to Ottawa to present the said petitions and interview the Government authorities in furtherance thereof, and that the actual expense of the said delegation be defrayed by this Council. Passed.

It was thereupon moved by Mayor Martin seconded by Mayor Darche that:—J. A. Mousseau, Esq., Advocate, T. R. Buteed, Esq., Mayor of Mann, G. M. Kempfer, Esq., Secretary Treasurer County Council be the three delegates under the said resolution appointed by this Council, with full power to attend at all matters of interest relating to the County with the said authorities at Ottawa. Passed.

A communication from Mayor M. S. Adams of Matapedia with regard to his unavoidable absence was read by the Sec-Treas. and duly filed.

The notice of the election of Peter Bourdages as Mayor of Hamilton vice K. N. LeBlanc, was also filed.

The Secretary Treasurer was instructed to again write to the Attorney General of Quebec with regard to the holding of Circuits of the Courts at the western end of the County, and to draw his attention again to the resolutions relating thereto passed by this Council at the last meeting thereof in March.

The change of names of the Municipalities of Nouvelle & Shoulbred, North East Part, and Nouvelle & Shoulbred, South West Part, was then discussed by the Council, whereupon it was moved by Mayor Buteed, seconded by Mayor Chapados, that the following By-law be adopted by this Council:—

Whereas it is desirable and expedient that the name of the said Municipality of Nouvelle and Shoulbred South West Part be changed to that of the Municipality of Escuminac.

Therefore the said Municipality of Nouvelle and Shoulbred South West Part shall henceforth be known as the Municipality of Escuminac. Passed.

Proposed by Mayor Frenette seconded by Mayor Martin, that the following By-law be adopted by this Council:—

BRITISH ARMY MANOEUVRES

Drawing to a Close for Year.

London, Sept. 16.—The war in East India which is the culmination of this year's army manoeuvres, starts today, and the King, who arrives in the manoeuvre area to-morrow morning, will follow the course of operations throughout.

The number of troops engaged is 60,000, and the plan of operations is an attempt at the repulse of invading army on London from the direction of Germany, the scene of operations adjoining the eastern coast line of England. Manoeuvres in early stages will be confined to Norfolk and Cambridge, though later they will cover an area including Norfolk, Suffolk, Essex, Hertford, Huntingdon and Bedford.

The invading force has 2,500 more men, the use of one airship and eight aeroplanes. It is expected that red and blue armies will clash to-morrow. By that time King George will have reached the scene of operations and all military attaches will have taken the field.

Much interest will turn on the use of aeroplanes. The War Office has issued special order, eliminating the monoplane from the manoeuvre, pending tests of this type of machines.

W. REDMOND M. P. IS COMING OVER

Dublin, Sept. 13.—Wm. H. K. Redmond, M. P. for Clare East, and brother of John E. Redmond, the Irish National leader, will leave for America on the steamer Baltic, sailing tomorrow. Mr. Redmond will be accompanied by his wife. He will attend the Irish league convention at Philadelphia, September 23rd, and will deliver speeches at New York, Boston, Atlantic City, Portland, Chicago, Washington, Brooklyn and Montreal. He will leave on his return to this country October 10th.

NO SESSION TILL JANUARY

Ottawa, Sept. 16.—Among groups of members of parliament now in the city the probability of the new session are being discussed and while the matter has not yet been considered by the cabinet, the opinion is widely entertained that the house may not assemble till immediately after New Year's. There is an immense amount of work to be got ready and once the house opens the ministers have only one day a week—Saturdays—for council meetings. Furthermore, it has been repeatedly demonstrated that a fall session accomplishes little beyond much talk. It is rarely that big constructive policies are announced before Christmas and when they are nothing beyond preliminary stages are ordinarily reached. The ordinary member prefers a January session as conducive to work from the start and less talk. The decision however, rests wholly with the government.

HUNTING SEASON IN FULL SWING

With the advent of the fifteenth the game hunting season is now in full swing and the usual rush for permits has been experienced. Mr. Wm. Gremlay, who has now these licences on hand, stated to our reporter that up till Tuesday afternoon he had issued 86 permits, all from local hunters. The American sportsmen have not yet arrived, but Mr. Gremlay has advice of two parties, who will arrive here probably Sunday and they are expected to be followed by others. Game is reported plentiful and good sport is assured if the weather conditions prove favorable.

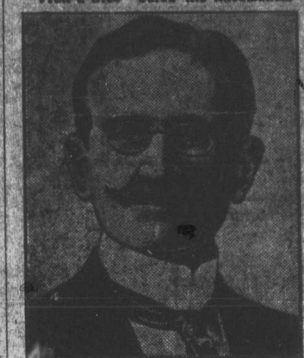
