#### NEW RESIDENCES

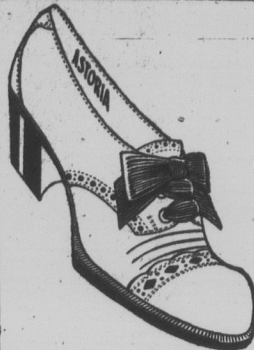

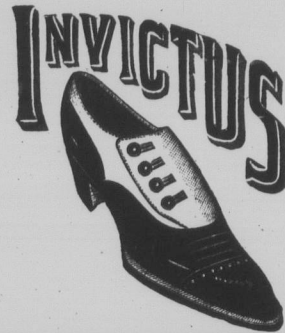
