

THE CHOLERA IN PARIS.

PROPOSED FINANCIAL REFORM IN RUSSIA. The redistribution bill—Progress of the Russian Campaign—France and China—Other foreign news.

PARIS, Nov. 8.—Thirty-seven fresh cases of cholera in Paris yesterday and twelve deaths. In view of the small proportion of deaths the doctors believe that the epidemic is not likely to spread.

Campanese, prefect of the police department of the Seine, told the council of the department yesterday that the cholera had appeared at Aubervilliers in July, and that 100 deaths had occurred there, but that the progress of the disease was checked this time by energetic measures promptly taken.

THE BYZANTINE CAMPAIGN. WADZ HATZA, Nov. 8.—The great god of the second catarrh has been closed. Owing to low water in the river Nile all boats have to be portaged around the catarrh.

An Arab, arrived at Dongola from Khartoum by the way of Shendi and Ambaki, says water and fodder for the cattle are plentiful on the route. The mahdi is engaged in a constant fight with the chairs for the lack of Hicks Pasha's army.

Lord Wolsey telegraphs that the mahdi with a small following was reported to be at Korthambat, north of Khartoum, whether he went there for the night at Amderman. All of the Kababshah tribe have deserted him.

THE BRITISH SABBATH. LONDON, Nov. 8.—In the commons to-day Martineau, liberal, offered resolutions, with the approval of the conservative leaders, which were laid upon the table, providing for the suspension of the sinking fund, which is devoted to paying off the national debt, for two years, and placing the amount, \$60,000,000, at the disposal of the admiralty board for the increase of the navy.

Financial Reform in Austria. VIENNA, Nov. 8.—Dunajowski, minister of finance, has prepared a measure to be submitted to the Reichsrath which, if adopted, will result in the resumption of cash payments on a gold basis throughout Austria and Hungary.

Redistribution of Parliamentary Seats. LONDON, Nov. 8.—The cabinet has been unable to agree on a plan for the redistribution of parliamentary seats, and refused the draft of the scheme recently published by the ministerial committee for amendment.

France and China. PARIS, Nov. 8.—A despatch from Gen. Briere de Lisle, dated Nov. 7, says the Chinese have made a fresh attack on Tayen Quad. They were easily repulsed.

Albert Edward's Birthday Celebrated. LONDON, Nov. 8.—The anniversary of the Prince of Wales' birthday (he was born on November 9, 1841) was celebrated with the usual festivities to-day as is customary on the actual date happens to be Sunday. The church bells have been ringing and salutes of artillery fired at various points.

Strengthening the British Navy. LONDON, Nov. 8.—The admiralty board has ordered the construction of four torpedo cruisers and a number of torpedo vessels for service at all important ports and in the British colonies.

An Informer Poisoned. MOSCOW, Nov. 8.—Rozoff, who denounced to the police many of his fellow students as nihilists, has been poisoned in prison, where he was kept for safety.

Is it a Steep? LONDON, Nov. 8.—Lloyd (conservative) was elected to parliament for Warwickshire to-day in place of Leigh (liberal), deceased.

A Gunboat for the Sale of Spain. LONDON, Nov. 8.—A gunboat with masts and polemen on board is expected to reach the Isle of Sky next Tuesday.
