Upon the Commissioners With Re-spect to the Island License. representative and influential deputation of Island residents and voters appeared before the License Commisers yesterday in support of the apfor the sale of beer and wine for the Toronto Ferry Company's new hotel at Hanlan's Point.

The deputation consisted of Lieut.Col. John I. Davidson, William Armstrong, C.E.; J. E. Robertson, N. Weatherstone, John Dick, Norman Macrae and others.
Mr. Hammond of the Ferry Company was also present. Several members of the deputation

addressed the Commissioners, urging upon them strongly the granting of a license. They pointed out that, while they would not support a spirit license for the Island, they were strongly of the opinion that a license to sell beer and light wines during the support and light wines during the summer months had become an absolute neces-sity. Good water could not be obtain on the Island, either for the resi dents or for the general public, and something must be done to put a stop to the iniquitous custom of taking over epirits from the city to the Island in bottles, a practice over which the Commissioners and the police had no control. They believed that They believed that a well-regulated beer and wine license would accomplish this end. The petition in favor of the icense had been signed by an overwhelm ing majority of the voters and residents who lived on the Island with their families, and who knew thoroughly the conditions at present existing, and might be depended upon not to advocate any measure that would tend to make the place a less pleasant spot for them-selves and their families, or for the pub-lic generally.

Mr. Hammond, on behalf of the Toronto Ferry Company, then addressed the commissioners. He pointed out that the Toronto Ferry Company had now a large pecuniary interest in the Island and that they could be depended upon to see that the law would be strictly complied with in their own interests, and that nothing would be left undone to make the Island safe for women and children. The commissioners must not hildren. The commissioners must not suppose that the opponents of the license represented the views of the majority of the citizens. Judging from the sup-port the application was receiving on all hands, Mr. Hammond believed that a large majority of citizens were in favor of the granting of the license. He urged that the commissioners should at all The commissioners promised to give the application due consideration and the deputation then withdrew.
