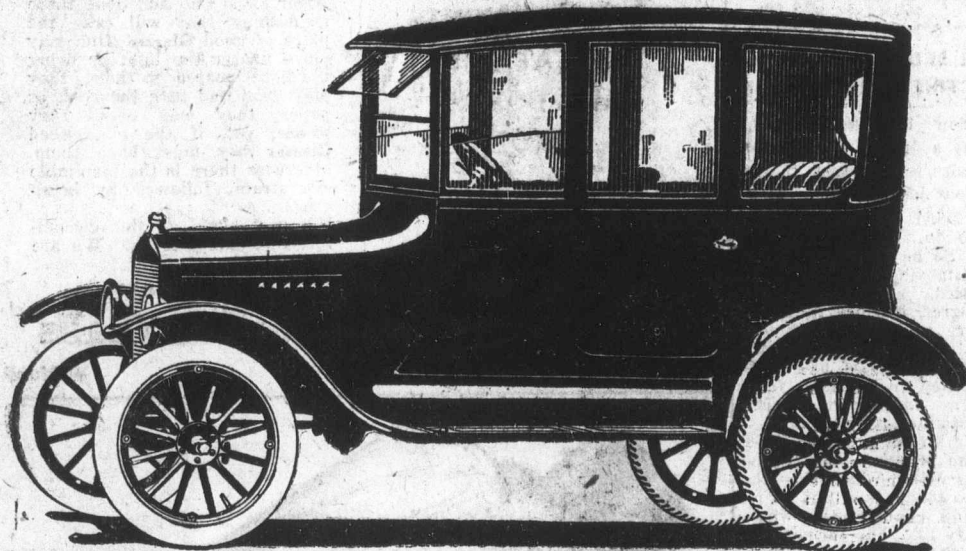

THE AMERICAN EMERGENCY TARIFF

To minimize the passage by the American Congress of the emergency tariff bill would be folly. It is directly aimed at Canada and at Canadian agricultural products in the interests of the United States. It is to be in force for six months, and in the mean time the general American tariff revision will be completed. Whether the emergency tariff is continued or not depends upon the attitude of the American consumer.

The new tariff hits the wheat grower and cattle raiser particularly hard. There is a duty of 35 cents a bushel on wheat and 30 per cent. on cattle. However, there are not many lines of agricultural products, which are missed. The duties of the new tariff are as follows:

Wheat, 35 cents a bushel.
Flaxseed, 30 cents bushel (56lb).
Wheat flour, 20 per cent.
Maize, 15 cents a bushel.
Beans, two cents a pound.
Ground beans, three cents a pound.
Potatoes, 25 cents a bushel (60 pounds).

Onions, 40 cents a bushel (57lb).
Cattle, 30 per cent.
Sheep, one year or over, \$2.
Sheep, less than one year, \$1.
Fresh or frozen meats, two cents a pound.

Prepared or preserved meats, 25 per cent.

Live stock for breeding purposes, free.

Wool, unwashed, 15 cents a pound.

Wool, washed, 30 cents a pound.

Wool, scoured, 45 cents a pound.

Butter and substitutes six cents a pound.

Cheese and substitutes, 23 per cent.

Fresh milk, two cents a gallon.

Cream, five cents a gallon.

Preserved or condensed milk, two cents a pound.

Sugar of milk, five cents a pound.

Wrapper tobacco, unstemmed, \$2.35 a pound.

Wrapper tobacco, stemmed, \$3 a pound.

Filler tobacco, unstemmed, 35 cents a pound.

Filler tobacco, stemmed, 50 cents a pound.

Apples, 20 cents a bushel.

Cherries, three cents a pound.

DEATH OF FORMER WARWICK RESIDENT

Strathroy, May 15.—The death occurred on Friday afternoon at the residence of her son-in-law, J. S. Clarke, Oxford street, of Mary Lancaster, relict of G. Hodgson. Mrs. Hodgson was Strathroy's oldest resident, being 101 years of age. She was born in Leeds, England, May 14, 1820, and came to this continent when 18 years of age. She was married in New York City to G. Hodgson, who predeceased her 25 years. They came to Canada, settling at Dufferin Creek, now called Pickering where they conducted a tannery, shoe and harness business, and came west in 1872, settling on a farm in Adelaide township, where they resided for six years, removing to Warwick Village. Mrs. Hodgson came to this town three years ago, making her home with her daughter, Mrs. J. S. Clarke, where she made many new friends, and up till a little over a week ago she enjoyed good health. She suffered a fall a week ago Tuesday and never recovered from the shock. The funeral took place from the residence of her son-in-law, Mr. J. S. Clarke, Oxford street, this afternoon. Interment was made in Strathroy cemetery.

DOGS WORRY CATTLE TO DEATH

Two dogs attacked a herd of young steers Saturday on a pasture farm a mile west of Petrolia, and chased and worried them, so that one animal died of wounds and exhaustion, and a second is not likely to recover. The remainder of the herd are in a very nervous and stiffened-up condition, which will probably be a season's set-back to them.

Ten days ago two dogs, presumably the same two, attacked a herd of milk cows and young cattle on a farm within a mile of the scene of yesterday's depredations and worried two of the young cattle to death.

Both of the attacks were made early in the morning and were continued till about eight o'clock, when the cries of the tortured cattle gave the alarm and the dogs were driven off. In both cases the cattle were horribly mutilated about the ears and head and on the heels and hind-quarters.

One of the dogs, a mongrel bull, was traced to his home in Petrolia and shot. The other dog, said to be a collie, has not yet been run to earth. These are the first instances in this county where cattle have been attacked in this manner and fatally worried.
