caries or calculus. A week afterwards I inserted the apparatus for expanding the superior arch. It was worn with comparative comfort until the periodical return of the menses, when the margins of the gums—which the plate did not touch—were inflamed, as if by the rough inner edges of a badly-fitting vulcanite plate, and the bleeding reappeared. Upon examination of the apparatus there were no exciting mechanical cause to produce such a result, and I was at a loss for an explanation until I found that the blood was non-coagulable, and that the same symptoms of hysteria were present, which I had observed the previous month. I then made it my duty to extend my inquiries, and learned that the condition was regularly present each month, associated with severe migraine, and that the bleeding began and ceased coincidently with the recurrence and cessation of menstruation. As I write, the ninth observation has been made
