Rain fell on 6 days during 56 hours 50 minutes. It snowed on 12 days during 7 hours 15 minutes. Of the former there fell 0.64 inches; and depth of the latter 17.93 inches. This melted and added to the former yielded a total of 3.81 inches rain in depth.

The most prevalent wind was the N. E.

The most windy day was the 11th.
The most windy hour was between 4 and 5 a. m. of same.

There was no calm day.

Cloudless days occurred on 5th, 10th, 22nd, 23rd and 31st.
