

In volume 2 of the Naturalist, its
Editor gives another paper on Canadian
-an birds, this, gives a pleasingly
-history of the Rosy, male, or Song Spar-
-row, and also notes on the White-
throated, white-crowned, and Fall-
--a-tailed Sparrows, and in this vol-
-ume - as already noted - is pub-
-lished, the article on the Winter
Birds of the Great Bear, by Mr. D.
McLean; and also a short ac-
-count of a Ruffed Grouse, by an
-other writer.

In volume 3 of the Canadian
Naturalist and Geologist, there is
no article devoted to Birds except
a short report on the abberation of
the Wild Pigeon, by a Correspond-
ent at Barrie, C. W. but in Vol-
-ume 4 of this magazine there
is a long and very interesting list
with historical notes on the Birds
of the Lower St. Lawrence, by Mr.
Robert Bell, M. A. of the Geological
Survey. In this list Mr. Bell mentions
on the following birds, - Bald Eagle,
Sharp-shinned Hawk, Barred Owl, Cliff
Hawk, White bellied Swallow, Cliff
Swallow, Barn Swallow, Purple Martin
