The annual meeting of the British America Assurance Company held recently, a report of which appears elsewhere in this issue of THE CANADA PRESBYTERIAN, reveals a most satisfactory state of affairs, and in spite of the heavy fire losses in Toronto the early part of the year, and the exceptional marine losses later in the season, the company, by judicious selection of business and prudent management, has been able to record a good margin of profit upon the year's work. The financial statement shows the total income to be \$1,551,476, and losses and expenses to amount to \$1,491,640. The president, Mr. G. A.
