We understand that II.M.S. Sultan will be ommissioned as soon as she is ready. A fine lithographic print, representing this magnificent vessel at sea, has been published by Mr. J. B. Day, the well-known lithographer of Savoy Street. The engines of the Sultan are of 1200 nominal horse-power, and her armament consists of four 9 inch 12 ton guns on the upper deck, and eight Winch 18 inch guns on the main deck, the whole of which are mounted and worked on the carriages designed by Captain Scott, R. N. The Sultan was built from the designs of the late Chief Constructor, Mr. E. J. Reed .- Broad Arrow.
