# II. Holidays and Vacations.

Notice is hereby given to Trustees of Schools and others, that CHAPTER XI, of the COMMENTS AND REGULATIONS OF THE COUNCIL OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION. "Of Time in Session, Holidays, and Vacations" has been revised as follows:

# HOLIDAYS.

The following Regulations have been added to Section 3, of

The following Regulations have been added to Section 3, of the Chapter above-named.

a. When for any cause the Trustees of a school shall deem it desirable that any prescribed Traching Day should be given as a Holiday, the school or schools may be kept in session on the Saturday of the week in which such Holiday has been given, and such Saturday shall be held to be in all respects a legal Traching day.

b. When, owing to illness, or for any other just cause, a teacher losse any number of prescribed teaching days, such teacher shall have the privilege of making up for such lost days, to the extent of six during any Term, by Teaching on Saturdays; list

c. No School shall be kept in session more than five days per week for any two consecutive weeks:

d. Nor shall any Teacher teach more than five days per week on the average (vacations not being counted) during the period of his engagement in any term.

The Amilyersary of the Queen's Birthday shall be a Holiday in all the

any term.

The Anniversary of the Queen's Burrieday shall be a Holiday in all the Public Schools, as herelower; also any day proclaimed as a public holiday throughout the Province.

#### VACATIONS.

The following Regulations have been made in lieu of Section 4, of the Chapter above-named :-

1. The Christmas Vacation shall remain as heretofore, the "eight days', being held to mean week-days other than Saturdays
2. Instead of two vacations during the summer term in week at seed time and a forthight at harvest) as heretofore, there weeks (15 week-days other than Saturdays) shall hereafter be given as vacation during the summer term, at such time or times as the Trustees shall decide: Nevertheless
3. In order that the due Inspection of Schools as required by law, may not be interfered with, each Inspector shall have power, not with standing anything in the foregoing Regulations, to give notice of the day or days on which he proposes to visit any school or schools in his county for the purpose of Inspection, and to require that on the day or days so named such school or schools shall be kept in session.

#### III. Teachers' Agreements.

The attention of Teachers and Trustees is again called to the necessity of complying with the provisions of the Law in relation to the disposal of the county Fund. It appears from the School Returns of the past Term that some teachers have in their agreements with Trustees in respect to salary, assumed all risk as to the amount to be received from the County Fund. Such proceeding is contrary to the provisions of the law and directly subversive of a most important principle of the School system, since the pecuniary penalty imposed upon the inhabitants of the since the pecuniary penalty imposed upon the initialities of the section by the absence and irregular attendance of pupils is thereby inflicted upon the teacher, while the pecuniary rewards consequent upon a large and regular attendance of pupils at school is diverted from the people to the teacher. These results clearly tend to prevent the growth and development of a sentiment of responsibility and interest among all the inhabitants of each section and thus measurably defeat the chiest of the of each section, and thus measurably defeat the object of the whole system—the education of every child in the Province.

The Superintendent of Education, therefore, calls the attention of Teachers and Trustees to the following

#### NOTICE

1 The COUNTY FUND is paid to the TRUSTERS of the section. The amount depends upon the number of pupils, the regularity of their attendance, and the number of prescribed teaching days on which school is open in any section during the term.

2. Teachers must engage with Trustees at a definite sum or rate 'The Provincial grant is paid to teachers in addition to such specified sum.

3. The following form of agreement is in accordance with the law:

# (FORM OF AGREEMENT.)

A.D. 186 , between [mame of teacher] a duly licensed teacher of the—class of the one part, and [names of Trustees] Trustees of School Section No.—in the district of—of the second part.

The said [mame of teacher] on his for her] part, in consideration of the below mentioned agreements by the parties of the second part, hereby covenants and agrees with the said [mame of Trustees] Trustees as aforetaid and their successors in office, diligently and faithfully to teach a public school in the said section under the authority of the said Trustees and their successors in office during the School Year (or Term) ending on the thirt-first day of October next, (or the thirtieth day of April, as the case may be.)

And the said Trustees and their successors in office on their part covenant and agree with the said [mame of teacher] Tracher as aforesaid, to pay the said [mame of teacher] out of the School Funds under their control, at the rate of dolars for the School Year (or Term.)

And it is hereby further motually agreed that both parties to this agreement shall be in all respects subject to the provisions of the School Law and the Regulations made under its authority by the Council of Public Instruction.
