THE MILITIA BILL.

The Militia Bill passed its third reading on the 11th inst., on a division of 58 to 32; and Mr. Dorian's amendment (of Montreal), to suspend the operation of the bill till May 1st, 1856, was negatived by 57 to 33.

European News.

ARRIVAL OF THE "AFRICA." HALIFAX, April 25. The Royal Mail steamship Africa arrived at this port en route for Boston, and will be due about noon on Thursday. She left Liverpool on the 14th inst., and brings the news of her own arrival out on the 7th.
