\$2.118 million in 1989/90 to \$9.149 million in 1992/93. Most of this has come about because of a significant increase in program activity requiring additional funding. As a result, non-discretionary funding grew from \$0 in 1988/89, to \$4.741 million in 1992/93. This is because the APFC became the executing agent for part of Pacific 2000 (\$2.055 million in 1992/93), and it took over the management of GLOBE series and initiated the Canada/Asia Trade and Transport Forum. In addition its core funding from the federal government more than doubled (\$1.0 million in 1989/90 to \$2.231 million in 1992/93). The number of APFC staff increased to 43. Regional offices were established in BC (Victoria)., Alberta, Saskatchewan, Ontario, and Quebec, and overseas offices were established in Taipei, Tokyo, and Singapore<sup>13</sup>.
