

Soviet Union. The British were livid. They thought this was much too hasty. Bevin, the British Foreign Secretary, was really upset. Many Israelis and British told me that he was anti-Semitic. I have had lots of confirmation of that.

That was a dramatic moment. One Arab after another went to the podium. Fawzi said he had been misled. It was a fake.

"The Americans had told us they wanted to bring about a peaceful solution. They misled us. It is all fakery."

Zafula Khan of Pakistan was a strong supporter of the Arabs and more intelligent in his historical arguments than many others who were motivated primarily by emotions and psychological reactions. He was trying to be political, historical, and legal. He stood up and said, "Well, so be it, but there are going to be a lot of problems and troubles." This is what I remember. I'm speaking everything as I recall it.

I'm not sure when it was that they set up the Truce Supervision Organization. The Security Council called for a truce. They appointed a chief of staff of the organization.

The first one was General Burns of Canada. He went out there.

JK: He is no longer living. Is that correct?

Epstein: Yes, he's dead. But he wrote a book about it. I remember the Security Council appointing a mediator and calling for a six weeks truce. They set up the Truce
