- 2. Did Saskatchewan officials of the Health of Animals Branch put the farm of Leonard Wass, McLean, Saskatchewan, under any form of isolation or quarantine? If so, on what date?
- 3. Were there any test animals injected in the Regina area? If so, what animals were used?
- 4. If horses were used, were there any positive reactions? If so, on what date, and to whom was it reported?
- 5. Did any officer of the Health of Animals Branch in Saskatchewan refuse to accept specimens of infected material from private veterinarians? If so, on what date and for what reason?
- 6. Have any suspicious clinical symptoms been reported by Health of Animals Branch Inspectors at either of the Regina Abattoirs? If so, what was the report, and on what date was it received?

Mr. St. Laurent, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copy of Statutory Orders and Regulations published in the *Canada Gazette* (Part II) of Wednesday, March 12, 1952, under the provisions of Section 6 of the Regulations Act, Chapter 50 of the Statutes of Canada, 1950 (First Session). (English and French).

Mr. Garson, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Report on the Administration of Part V, Royal Canadian Mounted Police Act, 1948, for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1951, in respect of pensions, contributions, gratuities, retiring allowances, etc., pursuant to Section 106, Chapter 28, Statutes of Canada, 1948.

Mr. Lesage, Parliamentary Assistant to the Secretary of State for External Affairs, laid before the House,—Report on Canada's Activities in connection with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) for the year ended December 31, 1951. (English and French).

The House then resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. George for an Address to His Excellency the Governor General in Reply to His Speech at the Opening of the Session, and on the proposed motion of Mr. Fair in amendment thereto, and on the proposed motion of Mr. Bryce in amendment to the said proposed amendment.
