REFERENCE OF ESTIMATES OF DEPARTMENT TO STANDING COMMITTEE

Hon. Paul Martin (Secretary of State for External Affairs): I move, seconded by my colleague the Minister of National Defence (Mr. Hellyer):

That items numbered 1 to 155 inclusive, and items numbered L10 and L15, as listed in the main estimates, 1963-64, and items numbered 1a to 117a inclusive, and items numbered L10a and L13a, as listed in the supplementary estimates (A), 1963-64, relating to the Department of External Affairs, be withdrawn from the committee of supply and be referred to the standing committee on external affairs, saving always the powers of the committee of supply in relation to the voting of public moneys.

In making this motion, I wish to point out an obvious error in the printing of the supplementary estimates at item L10a on page 25. This item should refer to an additional advance to the working capital fund of the United Nations organization and not to the world health organization.

CANADA GRAIN ACT

AMENDMENT TO REVISE DEFINITION OF "ELEVATOR"

Mr. H. A. Olson (Medicine Hat) moved for leave to introduce Bill No. C-114, to amend the Canada Grain Act (off-track elevator licensing).

Mr. Knowles: Explain.

Mr. Olson: The purpose of this bill is to revise the definition of "elevator" under the Canada Grain Act so that an inland elevator is no longer restricted to premises served directly by a railway. The amendment thus authorizes the board of grain commissioners to license premises which are off-track and served by other means of transportation.
