POINT-TO-POINT RACES IN RAIN

Good Crowd See Cross Country Meet of Hunt Club at Steele's Corners.

Despite the inclement weather, a fair-sized crowd assembled at Green Bush, on Yonge street, to view the annual point-to-point races of the Toronto Hunt Club Saturday afternoon. The course was beautifully laid out in the shape of a double "u," and, despite the fact that rain had been falling practically all day, the ground was in very good condition.

A program of five events had been arranged, including the races for the Minto Cup, the John Hendrie Challenge Cup, the Alfred Rogers Challenge Cup, as well as the competition for farmers' horses and the hunters' flat race.

PETER VOLO BEST OF BABY TROTTERS

Latest Marvel Another Proof of What Scientific Breeding Will Accomplish.

Peter Volo is the greatest young trotting horse the world ever knew. In 1891 Arion trotted to a two-year-old record of 2:19 1/2 to high wheels on the strength of which he was sold for \$125,000. Since then there have been developed such champions as Nancy Hanks 2:04, Aliz and Ulan 1:58, but all students of the racing game never have conceded that any was as phenomenal a trotter as was Arion.

In the juvenile division of the Kentucky Turf at Lexington last Monday Peter Volo reduced the world's record to 2:04 1/2. When the season opened last July he set a colt of this age a record for a three-year-old of 2:04 1/2. Broodmare sires expected that the day would come when a two-year-old would top a four-year-old, especially since the four-year-olds have made such wonderful progress during the last decade.
