

In the new industrial district created by the city's splendid harbor commission. Steam Roads Are Reluctant.

It is objected to the plan of bridge instead of a viaduct, that the waterfront will be spoiled by a series of ramps. How many railroads will be from the viaduct one cannot yet say.

Without professing to expound the present attitude of the various roads towards the viaduct two or three factors in the situation were apparent to any fairly intelligent observer. If the railways were reconciled to the viaduct would they not long ago have started to build it?

Viaduct championed that the Union Station was built in war time as a means of preventing the viaduct. They may do the railways an injustice, but they suggest that the viaduct will shortly be presented with this dilemma: "We have built a great station for you as you desired; but you cannot use it for several years if you insist on the viaduct. If you want the station you must let the trains come in on the present level."

Why should the present level be used? Will the situation be any worse than it is now? Yes, the present level is worse. The new station is so far east of the old that the trains will practically close Bay and Yonge streets. They will, therefore, be asked to allow temporary bridges across the tracks at Bay and Yonge, and then, Goodbye Viaduct.

The railways will have won the fight, and the waterfront will be much more prejudiced that the progress of Toronto as a port will be seriously impeded, to the advantage of the steam railroads which dislike all shipping they do not control.

Change for Radial.

No, they say, the viaduct's the thing, and its construction should be expedited. The tracks south of the present station can be put on trestles and the fill made speedily from work trains.

The other bottom of the shrewd and public-spirited men is the radial problem. Assuming that every action of the Hydro radicals scheme is a sound proposition, as drawn up, may not millions of dollars be saved by radiating the steam roads traffic that if the Grand Trunk were slaughtered, so much the worse for the city has made for the C.P.R. The C.P.R. is so glib that nothing will hurt it. And any way, the radial will cost less than manufacturing in the Lake Ontario hinterland that, in the lines of a venerable hymn, there will be of traffic as of divine grace.
