Frederick VIII. was proclaimed king of Denmark at noon to-day in Amalien-borg Square in front of the palace. The ceremony lasted only a few minutes. The premier, Mr. Christensen, appeared on the balcony of the palace and announced to the 50,000 persons assembled below the death of King Christian IX., and the accession of his eldest son. The premier then called for eldest son. The premier then called for cheers for King Frederick VIII. The new ruler of Denmark joined the premier on the balcony, and in a short speech declared that he would

short speech declared that he would rule in accordance with the example set him by his father, and trusted that the same accord between the King and nation would continue as heretofore. His Majesty concluded with calling for cheers for the fatherland.

King Frederick received a warmhearted greeting from the assembled crowd, whose cheers mingled enthusiastically with the national anthem.

Prior to the proclamation of his accession, King Frederick held a council of state, at which the ministers tendered their resignations, and were requested to retain their posts. Afterwards the new ruler received the cabinet ministers, presidents of the Riksdag, the civil and military officials, and the court dignitaries.
