FIGURING ON REDISTRIBUTION. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE CONCLUDES ONTARIO WOULD LOSE 6 MEMBERS.

Ottawa, Jan. 2.—The Ottawa correspondent of The Globe says: A memorandum prepared by the Department of Justice shows that according to the population as disclosed by the census Ontario will lose six members, Nova Scotia two, New Brunswick one and Prince Edward Island one; Manitoba gains three members, British Columbia one and the Northwest Territories two. The Northwest Territories at present have a representation of four members. If the same principle that obtains in the other divisions is applied to the Territories, they will have their representation increased to six in a redistributed House, therefore, the representation would then stand as follows: Ontario, 80; Quebec, 65; Nova Scotia, 18; New Brunswick, 14; Manitoba, 10; British Columbia, 7; Prince Edward Island, 4; Northwest Territories, 6; Yukon, 1-Total, 210. As the present membership of the House is 214, including the Yukon, the net loss in membership is four.

HOSPITAL OF GLASS. GREAT HOT HOUSE FOR HUMAN BEINGS TO BE BUILT.

Baltimore, Md., Jan. 2.—It is planned to erect a consumptive hospital near Bayview for the housing of patients who are suffering with this disease. It is said that conditions at the asylum are really alarming, and that even the physicians who come in contact with inmates express fear of contracting consumption. The scheme is to construct a large hospital of glass and steel. This, said Comptroller Smith, "will be a great 'hot house' for human beings. It is to be arranged so that the consumptives will be enabled to get fresh air and be shut in when the weather is unfavorable."

DR. MACDONELL DEAD. RAMSDEN IS THE MAN FOR WARD THREE.

Montreal, Jan. 2.—Dr. Angus C. Macdonell, 74 years of age, at one time chief factor of the Hudson Bay Company, and Governor at Port Temiskaming, died here this afternoon. He was for more than twenty years a member of the consulting staff of Hotel Dieu.

COMPANY HOUSING RAILWAY INTO RECENT PASTER

Evidence Being Brought Out of a Startling Character Which Was Not Introduced Before the Coroner's Jury at London.

London, Jan. 2.—(Special.)—The Wansted wreck of a week ago is being vigorously investigated by the officials of the Grand Trunk. The examination of employees is said to have already revealed some startling information of a character not touched upon by the coroner's jury. The officials assert that the public will not be supplied with the result of this investigation. 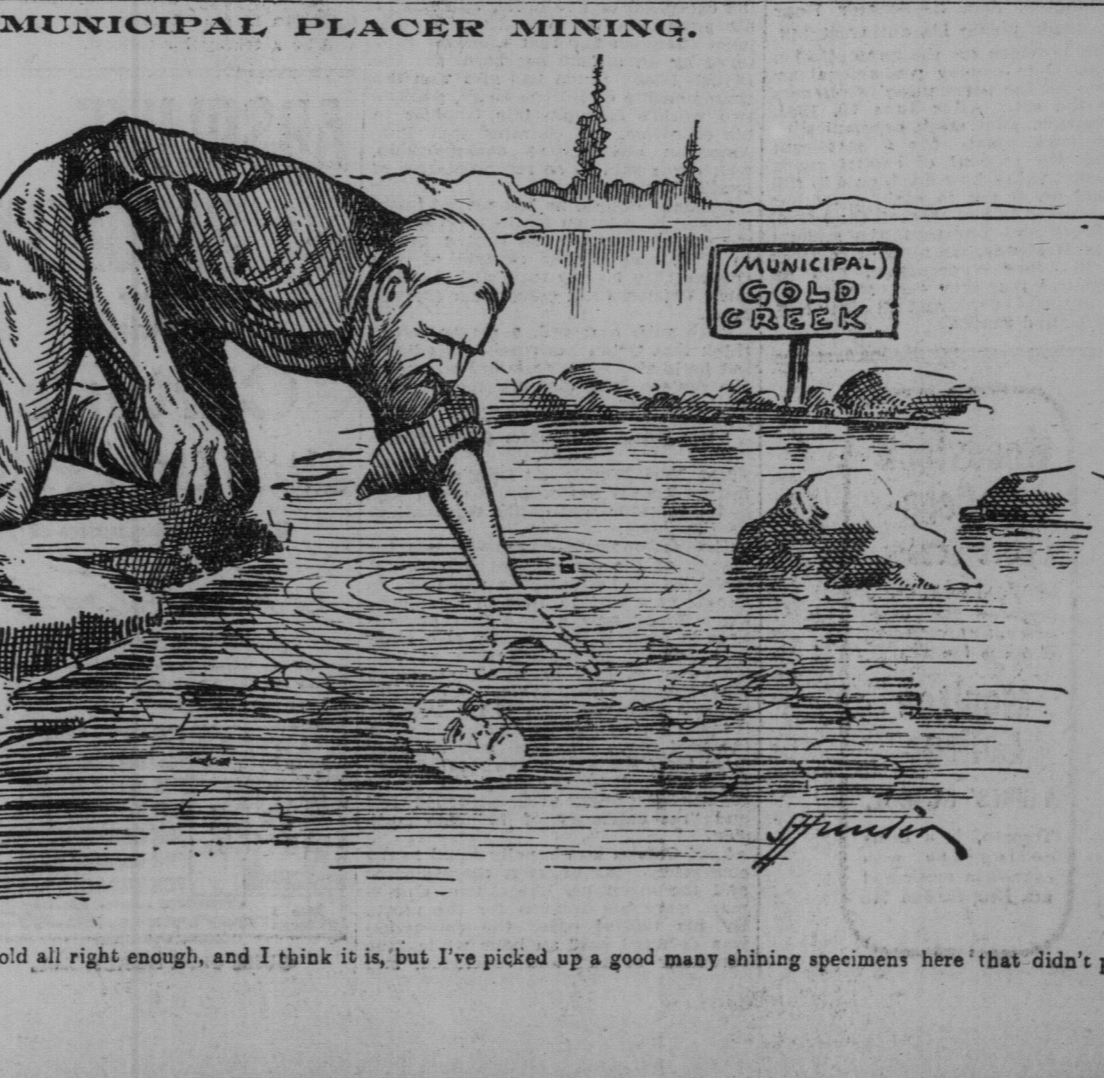
