

**P. R. MAY ADVANCE
TIMETABLE TO MEET
U. S. DAYLIGHT LAW**

P. R. Will Hold Incoming
Trains Hour at Border.

CHANGE COMES MONDAY

P. R. Trains for U. S. Will
Run as Usual and Be Hour
Late on Other Side.

MONTREAL, March 29.—Because of
the adoption of daylight saving by the
United States all trains from New York,
Boston, Chicago and other American
cities over the Canadian Pacific Rail-
way will be held an hour at the border,
beginning next Monday. This is made
necessary, the P. R. has announced,
because of the fact that trains have
been advertised to leave points between
here and the border at certain times,
and that the schedules cannot be
broken.

Incoming trains from the United
States will leave their points of depar-
ture an hour earlier, according to Cana-
dian time, and will run on the regular
time in Canada.

Outgoing trains will leave at the
usual time and will run an hour late
in American territory, according to
American time.

So far as could be learned this morn-
ing the Grand Trunk Railway plans to
run its trains an hour earlier and change
its timetable to correspond. The ar-
rangement is not final on the Grand
Trunk Railway, however. The officials
have not yet adopted the Canadian Pacific
plan. The permanency of the
new regulation will depend upon whether
or not Canada adopts the daylight
saving bill now before the House of
Commons at Ottawa.

**DESPERATE FIGHTING
LIKELY TO CONTINUE
2 MONTHS LONGER**

German Drive May Spur
America to Greater
Efforts.

LONDON, March 29.—Referring to
premier Lloyd George's urgent appeal
to the United States for more aid sent
through Earl Bessing, British ambas-
sador, the Daily Mail says: "This
appeal and its allies must be prepared
for another month, or perhaps two
months, of continuous fighting. To meet
the stupendous efforts and violent des-
peration of the enemy, our efforts and
those of our allies must be on an equal
scale."

The newspaper then briefly sums up
America's effort since entering the war
a year ago, and continues: "With this record many Americans
are by no means satisfied. It hurts
them to think that in this battle of
attrition they are not playing a greater
part. We think their self-reproaches
are exaggerated, but undoubtedly the Ger-
man offensive will not have been with-
out its use. It is the American to con-
sider the problems of raising and
equipping in France the greatest number
of trained soldiers. The resistance
America can render at this
crisis."

**CLASS "B" MEN TO
BE CALLED OUT FOR
NON-FIGHTING DUTY**

Necessary to Secure More
Men for Construction and
Other Work.

OTTAWA, March 29.—Responding to
demand from the military authori-
ties, the military service council has
decided to call up for service men in
medical category B under the military
service act. Category B men are liable
for overseas service, but not for combatant
duties. They are being called out be-
cause of the necessity of securing more
men for railway construction and simi-
lar work. The official memorandum
states: "The military demand for men for rail-
way construction and other similar work
is increasing, and it has therefore be-
come necessary to draft all men in
category B in respect of whom
grounds for exemption exist.
The military service council is there-
fore issuing instructions to registrars to
take immediate steps to call up such
men."

Under the procedure heretofore
adopted questions arising in regard to
exemption of men in medical cate-
gory B on other grounds were postponed
until men in "A" same medical category
could be called, and these men, as
well as their employers and relatives,
therefore been given an opportunity
of presenting claims for their exemp-

state food administrators.

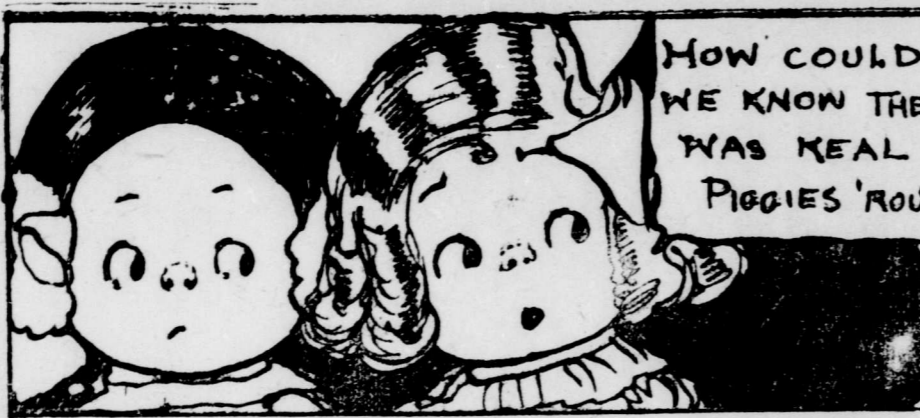

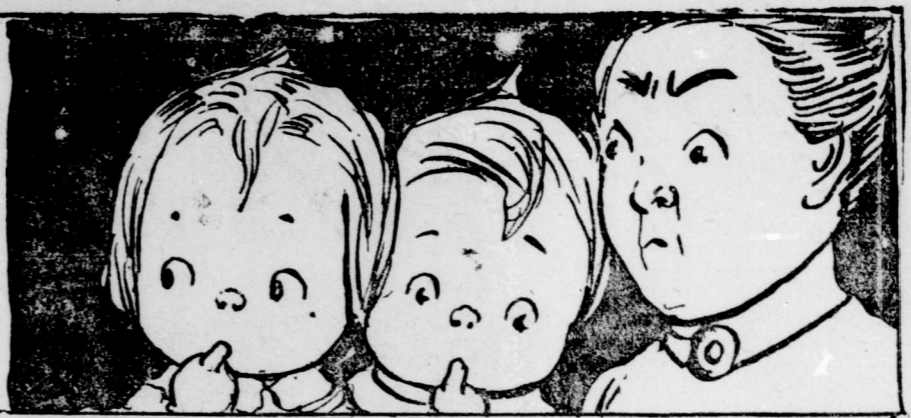

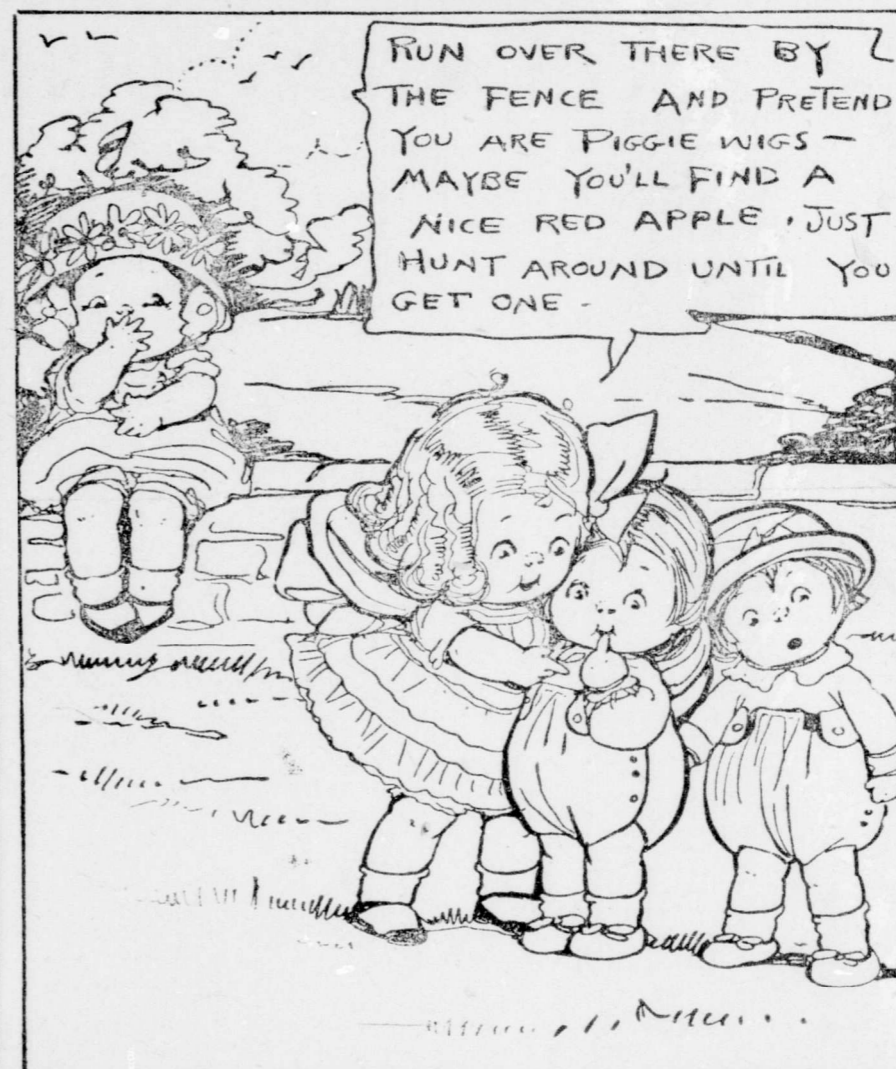
