FRED SIMPSON WINNER
APPLEBY COGS 15 MILES

Long Distance Runners Perform
Before Fair Crowd in the Cold

Fred Appleby, the English runner of whom so much has been heard, proved a counterfeit in Saturday's race with Fred Simpson, Appleby gutting in the

first lap of the sixteenth mile, or just a lap after Simpson passed him, the Hiawatha Indian finishing the last five miles alone.

Appleby set all the pace, but at the twelfth mile he was laboring very bad and it only looked a matter of a few miles before he threw up the sponge.

Appleby may have beaten Shrubbo at a distance of fifteen miles, but he will never do it again, as the Apple of to-day would run a million rings around the reputed Impor-tation from the old sod, who was once counted upon by the English critics and some of the Canadians as well to win the Olympic Marathon.

his staying power is limited to fifteen miles and not any more. Simpson ran a beautiful race, and bears out what Manager Crocker of the Canadian Olympic team said: "That Simpson was the coming Marathon runner. The time was very good for fifteen miles, it being 1:28.43, against 1:26.23 3-5

The crowd were all for Simpson and when Appleby quit, the cheering was loud and long, the crowd rushing over the field. Tommy Longboat was caught by the enthusiastic ones and carried around the field on the shoulders of his admirers.

Simpson ran a well judged race, letting Appleby set the pace to just as the fifteen-mile mark was in sight, when he passed him like a cyclone and opened up such a big gap that Appleby grew disheartened and threw up the sponge, just as soon as he reached his trainer, which was three-quarters of a mile on the six-
